## CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

The devastation caused by this year's monsoon and floods is still impacting the country. For some of the most vulnerable communities, there are risks of food insecurity, health issues, and shelter crises. It has made us even more content with our mission of uplifting the communities, improving their lives, and achieving lasting impact over poverty.

This quarter, our focus was to provide relief and rehabilitation facilities to flood affectees. SAF through the second phase of our flood relief campaign enabled the flood affectees to have food security through ration drives, health care through medical camps, and shelter through the SAF tent village and provision of tents.

To reach out to the affected communities and further the impact, SAF initiated multiple initiatives globally. As part of our Flood Relief Campaign, we organized multiple fundraisers in the UK; our UK Chapter advocated for the cause to raise much-needed funds. Along with this, our corporate partners provided their significant support in these times of need to enable SAF to reach out to the far-flung areas to provide relief for the flood affectees.

We reached 200 out-of-school children with the addition of a campus in Arkanabad; the campus will enroll additional 100 students and work towards uplifting the community by the provision of quality education and initiating vocational training programs at the school.

On behalf of the SAF Team, I'm grateful to our donors, supporters, partners, and friends who ensured Hope – Not Out for all. We are stronger when we work together.

## REHABILITATING DREAMS

### REACHING OUT THROUGH REHABILITATING DREAMS FUNDRAISER

With the successful conclusion of Rehabilitating Campaign last quarter, we are reaching out to the flood affectees. Phase II of the campaign – Sustaining is in process, and phase III of Rehabilitation is expected to start from January 2023 with the first model village in Mastung, Balochistan. The aiding of the affectees in this quarter includes:

#### MEDICAL CAMP AT SAF TENT VILLAGE

With the rise in health crisis in flood-affected areas due to waterborne diseases and harsh winters, SAF is holding medical camps regularly at different locations. A medical camp for 400 affectees at the SAF tent village in Mastung, Balochistan was conducted in October, and a second one in December. The medical camps are led by experienced female doctors who provided health care to women, children, and the elderly with free medicines. The medical camp will be held every month with ration drives taking place each month.



#### MONTHLY RATION DISTRIBUTION FOR THE BENEFICIARIES OF SAF TENT VILLAGE

Continuing the efforts to provide relief to the flood affectees, 143 households at the SAF tent village in Mastung, Balochistan aided with rations creating food security for them.



#### WINTERIZATION KITS

During the harsh winter season, the families affected by floods are facing new challenges, with all belongings lost they would have to face the severe winters in a tent. To ease the pain, winterization kit distribution has been initiated as part of the sustaining phase. Families living in Mastung were provided with winterization kits to bear the harsh winters. The drives are being extended to other parts of the province and then will be undertaken across the country.



## Building Dreams

### DRINKING WATER SCHEMES

As we continue our implementations of the **Building Dreams Campaign 2021** and reach more and more underserved communities, water schemes were added to our footprint in Balochistan.

- The **Delaware community** made it possible for SAF to install an RO Plant in **Muslim Bagh, Qilla Saifullah**. The plant will benefit a community of **2,000 households** with clean drinking water.

- With the support of the **Houston Community** a water supply scheme was installed in **Toray Shah, Qilla Abdullah**. This project will benefit at least **300 households** by providing them with an adequate, safe, and accessible continuous water supply.



## REACHING MORE VULNERABLE COMMUNITIES

To expand our impact, we have partnered with international aid agencies; the partnerships have empowered us to reach remote and vulnerable communities, serving more households, and alleviating them to build back.

### AUS RELIEF

The partnership with Aus Relief has helped us provide relief to over **475 households** with ration and over 50 families with tents in **Lasbela, Balochistan, and Jhangara, district Jamshoro, Sindh**. The ration bag included flour, rice, grains, cooking oil, sugar, and salt, with weatherproof tents helping them with shelter till they get their homes rebuilt.



### GIM FOUNDATION

In collaboration with GIM Foundation, SAF distributed rations to **170 flood-affected households** in **Pakka Channa, District Jamshoro, Sindh** ensuring food security for the community. Breaching of the Manchhar lake's bank at various points due to floods, displaced some 125,000 people in district Jamshoro thus the communities in this region required immediate relief support.



### SMEC FOUNDATION

Facilitating progress, one step at a time. SAF collaborated with SMEC Foundation to uplift the severed communities through interventions in water and emergency relief initiatives. Strengthening our efforts of Hope Not-Out with SMEC Foundation! The SAF Australia team had a meeting with representatives from the SMEC Foundation to create pathways for a prosperous Pakistan.



### • WATER SUPPLY SCHEME IN MALAGORI

A water supply scheme was inaugurated for **2,000 households** of **Malagori, Tirah Valley in KPK**. The water supply scheme is the **first supply scheme in the area** that is facilitating two communities and a school in the vicinity.



### • FLOOD RELIEF DRIVE

**170 households** in **District Jamshoro, Sindh** were facilitated through ration drive. The community consists of labours and farmers whose livelihood was severely affected by the floods.



## PROMOTING DIGITAL LITERACY FOR SOCIO-ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Digital literacy is increasingly recognized as a central element of the skills a child requires for school, work, and life. To ensure students are equipped with the tools to succeed we have initiated a third IT lab with the support of our esteemed donors, the Shah Family at SAF school, Arkanabad Campus. We use an integrated approach to digital literacy that nurtures children's abilities to cope with today's connected world.



**SAF UK VOLUNTEERS NETWORK LEADING THE WAY TO REBUILD LIVES**

The SAF Student Network stayed at the forefront, raising funds and awareness about the relief efforts to support the flood affectees. The network organized different events at various universities across the UK and raised funds to support the SAF's Flood Relief Campaign. The Pakistani student societies at **Queen Mary, University College London**, and **Kings College London** took the initiative to collect funds for the flood affectees across Pakistan.



**SAF UK FUNDRAISERS FOR THE FLOOD AFFECTEES**

SAF UK chapter held a series of fundraisers to further the reach and aid to the flood affectees.

**EDINBURGH, SCOTLAND**

- The first fundraiser was hosted by World Care Foundation in collaboration with SAF UK on 8th October. The event was joined by Younus Khan and patrons to advocate the importance of supporting the flood affectees and share with them the plan SAF has to help affectees, build back their lives. The fundraiser was a huge success and funds were raised to **support 50 families** in Sindh by building their homes.



- The second fundraiser took place on the following day, 9th October to further support for the flood affectees. The support of diaspora communities and our staunch supporters have enabled us to reach **another 50 families** in Sindh. The support will enable them to build home and regenerate their livelihoods.



**OSLO, NORWAY**

We extended our fundraiser to Oslo, Norway where we were joined by the Pakistani community to raise much-needed funds. **Mr. Aamir Sheikh**, graciously hosted the fundraiser to support SAF Flood Relief Campaign. The success of the fundraiser was possible with the support of Former Norwegian **PM Mr. Kjell Magne Bondevik**, **Pakistani Ambassador Mr. Babar Amin** and other like-minded people.



**LONDON**

The series of our fundraisers reached London on 25th November, this time we were joined by actor **Adnan Siddiqui**, who shared his experience of working for the flood affectees and how SAF is making a difference in their lives.



**BIRMINGHAM**

The community in Birmingham joined forces to empower the affectees. The assistance provided by the community demonstrated how important flood victims' recovery is to our overseas communities. With generous support by them, we will be reaching a huge population of the affectees by providing them with medical care, homes and food security.



**UXBRIDGE**

The final fundraiser took place in Uxbridge on 27th November; the fundraiser supported the cause to improve food security in the region and provide medical assistance to the affectees who have lost everything in the floods.



## FOOTBALL TOURNAMENT BY CRYSTAL PALACE

Palace for Life Foundation in collaboration with SAF UK organized a football tournament to create awareness about the severity of the devastation due to floods in Pakistan and raise funds to rehabilitate the flood affectees. Proceed from the tickets of the tournament helped us provide shelter, food, and other essentials to the affectees.

## ENCOURAGING DIVERSITY THROUGH SPORTS

SAF UK chapter in the path of carrying forward our mission to advance athletic development collaborated with CricketWales and Glamorgan Cricket to provide an opportunity to the youth especially girls to play cricket. The program took place at Sophia Gardens, Cardiff, where teams competed in different competitions, raised funds, and created awareness for the cause.



# SAF ENDEAVORS

## EMERGENCY RELIEF RESPONSE

### FLOODS IN PAKISTAN

Months after unprecedented floods ravaged Pakistan, vast swathes of cropland and villages remain under water, while nearly 10 million remain in need of immediate, lifesaving support. In this quarter, our efforts have reached to **over 100,000 direct beneficiaries** i.e. 10,000 households and are creating food security, health assistance and temporary shelters for them. SAF is pacing up for **Phase 3**, which is **Rehabilitating the affectees** by building their **homes**, providing **livestock** and **life essentials** so that they can restart their lives.

### SAF TENT VILLAGE

Under Phase 2 of the SAF Flood Relief Campaign, we have established a tent village for the affectees, the tent village facilitated **143 households: over 1000 individuals**. They were provided with Food, Shelter, Water, and all the necessities for a household so they can focus on other aspects of rebuilding their lives.

The beneficiaries at the tent village are provided with monthly rations, and kitchen utensils to ensure food security. Regular medical camps are held at the tent village with experienced doctors and free medicines for the beneficiaries to minimize the spread of any illness or disease.



### DISTRIBUTION OF WINTERIZATION KITS IN FLOOD-AFFECTED AREAS

With the coming of winter, we distributed winterization kits for the flood affectees in the affected areas to counter the affects of harsh winters that can cause serious health conditions if not properly equipped for them. SAF's winterization Kits include Blankets, Warm Clothes, Socks, and Shoes for a household.

So far SAF has held winterization kits distribution across **8 districts of Balochistan**. **600 affectees** are facilitated with these kits that will help them prepare for the dry winter in Balochistan



## IDRF

With passing time, areas, where there are scours of affected individuals in dire need of flood relief, have become more evident to our team. SAF under its Emergency Relief Response joined forces

with IDRF to distribute rations among affected households in different parts of Sindh to provide relief to the flood affectees. In total SAF and IDRF provided relief to **2,970 households** which is more than **29,000 flood affectees** with monthly rations to help them cope in this time of need in **5 districts** of Sindh, **Sukkur, Khairpur, Qambar Shahdadkot, Larkana, and Dadu**. Most of these communities consist of daily wagers, and farmers who have lost their livelihoods by the flood.



## BUILDING PARTNERSHIPS FOR A STABLE TOMORROW

SAF formed partnerships with esteemed conglomerates in Pakistan to implement long-term rehabilitation plans for flood affectees. These partnerships have goals of providing sustainable housing and a stable future for those who have lost their all.

### BANK ALFALAH

SAF and Bank Alfalah joined hands with an aim to rehabilitate **1,000 families** across Balochistan and Sindh by providing them with Homes, Livelihood, Food Security, and Health Facilities through Phase 3 of SAF Flood Relief Campaign that is expected to be in the implementation stage by Jan 2023.



### CAREEM PAKISTAN

SAF and Careem signed an MOU to further the impact of SAF's Flood Relief Campaign. The support will directly help in rehabilitating the flood affectees through Phase 3 of our campaign which aims to provide **sustainable housing** for the flood affectees across Pakistan.



### PACKAGES FOUNDATION

Extending our partnership with Packages Foundation in the quarter we reached vulnerable households in Dadu district, Sindh; **250 households** were facilitated with ration bags, survival kits, and tents in collaboration with Packages Foundation through Tri-Pack Films Limited. The locale was on the brink of food shortages due to the infrastructure damage caused by the floods.



### BANK AL BARAKA

Along with Bank Al Baraka Pakistan Ltd, SAF team yet again distributed rations to the **150 households** that were gravely affected by the floods in Sehwan, Sindh. This was our second drive with Bank Al Baraka to further our goal of working towards a long-term solution to rehabilitate the flood affectees.



## EDUCATION

### UBANK SUPPORTS SAF EDUCATION

Under SAF education, we have partnered with U Microfinance Bank to impart digital literacy skills in Malikpur campus for **430 students** enrolled. Digital learning will help transform education by expanding the scope of education beyond traditional academic learning. UBank's CSR initiative will also ensure coding and programming skills development under the partnership to help students develop the right tools needed to succeed. The **IT Lab construction** is completed and will start functioning from Jan 2023, the coding program implementation is planned for April 2023.



## ADOPT A SCHOOL, SECURE A FUTURE

When it comes to building a better tomorrow, there is nothing more important than giving our youth opportunities to access quality education. SAF education is continuously creating opportunities to empower the youth with right tools to become independent, contributing members of the society. To reach our goals and objectives we have partnered with two major organizations under their corporate social responsibility program.

**PAKISTAN STATE OIL:** Continuing our work to reach more underprivileged students in Malikpur, Lahore PSO has adopted the campus for the third time, helping **430 students** enrolled at the campus to continue their education. The enjoined support enables the school in infrastructure, health and nutrition, teaching skills development, computer and science lab equipment and learning support.

**LUCKY CEMENT PVT. LTD:** The partnership with Lucky Cement has been extended for the third time in a row to educate **300 students** enrolled in Rehri Goth. The partnership is enabling the students to continue their educational journeys by cutting down socio economic barriers.

**HABIB OIL MILLS:** With the newly established partnership with Habib Oil Mills, surfeit opportunities will be available to the community through **the SAF school, Shahina Parveen Campus** in the Arkanabad area of Karachi. It will be providing learning variability through a holistic approach, create new and diverse learning possibilities, and assist students in achieving positive educational and well-being outcomes.

## MINI MBA

**140 parents** of SAF school students have been trained in entrepreneurial skills through Mini MBA program in collaboration with Peace Through Prosperity at **SAF School, Bhingoria Town Campus**. These skills will enable them to reap the benefit of entrepreneurship and will help foster innovation, promote economic development, and create jobs. Group sessions were conducted at various SAF school Campuses with opportunities for practical demonstrations of the entrepreneurial skills they learned during the program.



## ART THERAPY

Art can be a versatile form of therapy that can help children express their feelings in a free environment; Introducing Art Therapy program at SAF schools to help children discover deeper insights and understanding about themselves through the creative process, based on the understanding that thoughts and feelings arrive at us visually before language can describe them.

In sessions at Habib Oil Mills campus Arkanabad, we focused on working with art and other materials; building a safe, accepting, non-judgmental space, the importance was on the enjoyment we get from the creative process, and not necessarily on the final product.



## WATER

### IMPROVING WATER SUPPLY QUALITY, SANITATION, AND HYGIENE

SAF water's objective is to create access to water for the most vulnerable and underprivileged communities, helping them develop mechanisms for accessing and conserving water while using it for domestic and drinking purposes. To expand our footprint, we partnered with EFU Life to reach **400 families** in **Kirthar, Sindh** with a **solar-powered community tank**.





## SPORTS

### CRICKET FOR CHANGE – CFC

SAF concluded a successful Cricket for Change program with US Consulate General Lahore over an amazing and fun-filled closing ceremony attended by **SAF Chairman Shahid Afridi**, and **Mr. Karl Roger**, and **Mr. Richard Philips** from **U.S Consulate Lahore**. The program benefitted **230 boys and 220 girls in 6 cities across Punjab** through skill development training as well as trained **150 coaches** which ensures the continuation of these activities to empower our future generations.

Cricket for Change with US Consulate had 5 days camps for students at each selected school in **Multan, Bahawalpur, Toba Tek Singh, Faisalabad, Sheikhpura, and Lahore**. Matches were conducted on the ground among teams where students displayed their skills developed during the camps. CFC focused on developing **essential life skills** and **changing the attitudes and perspectives of the students** enrolled in the program. The CFC coaches helped students develop motor and cognitive skills while teaching them how to focus and accomplish goals, and, most importantly, how can they play cricket and choose sports as a career.

Notable officials and personalities including Tanveer Hassan (Cultural Affairs Specialist, U.S General Consulate General Lahore, Muhammad Talha (Pakistani Test Cricketer), Muhammad Salman (Pakistani Test Cricketer), and Rana Habib-ur-Rehman (Chairman - Standing Committee on Technical Education & Vocation Training) also visited the camps and distributed cricket kits, awarded trophies to winning teams, at various camps.



### DISABILITY INCLUSION IN SPORTS

SAF Sport is empowering young athletes and their communities to break free from poverty, for good through sponsorship of championships. This quarter we sponsored the **Disabled Persons Cricket Championship 2022**, empowering 12 Teams. Winning champions were celebrated at the end of the match encouraging them to continue their journeys in sports.



## HEALTH

### SECOND MOBILE HEALTH UNIT REACHES VULNERABLE COMMUNITIES

With the success of our first mobile unit reaching the most vulnerable and to continue reaching the vulnerable, SAF health partnered with Ismail Industries. The unit will reach communities across **Chakwal** and adjoining areas in **50KM radius** reaching out to **3,000 households**. This is a focused facility for Mothers and Children who are otherwise deprived of quality and convenient medical treatment in far-reaching areas.



### MOBILE HEALTH UNIT FACILITY NOW AVAILABLE FOR MOTHERS IN BALUCHISTAN

To support the vulnerable mothers and children in Baluchistan who do not have access to any healthcare facilities, we are reaching them with the Mobile Unit donated by Master Group. The project is in collaboration with **BCHIP** and **World Bank Pakistan**. The unit will target women living in the **outskirts of Quetta** and adjoining areas; covering **50km radius**.
